Notes

HIC - Nicholas Larson Home was grandfathered in to ESG funding . According to HUD guidance, it must continue to be reported in HMIS as Transitional Housing.

Nicholas Larson Home Bridge TH - Following the guidance received through an AAQ (as referenced below), the bed count is 3 since this is how the beds are designated, even though the PIT count is 0. These beds are utilized based on the current need in partnership with the Nicholas Larson Home Low Demand SH project (2 beds). On the night of the 2018 PIT count, all 5 beds were used as low demand beds.

Nicholas Larson Home Low Demand Safe Haven - Following the guidance received through an AAQ (as referenced below), the bed count is 2 since this is how the beds are designated. These beds, in combination of the Nicholas Larson Home GPD Bridge beds (3 TH beds), are utilized based on current client need. On the night of the 2018 PIT count, all 5 beds (3 GPD Bridge (TH), 2 GPD Low Demand (SH)) were used as GPD Low Demand (SH) beds, leaving us with a 250% utilization rate.

We submitted an AAQ regarding this situation and received this response - Since the projects are set-up as 3 Bridge/TH beds and 2 Low Demand/Safe Haven beds you should report them on the HIC capacity in this way. The project that had 5 full beds on the night of the count will end up showing a slight over utilization and the project that had 0 beds filled on the night of the count will show it as underutilized. However, your CoC will not be penalized for showing these two small projects as under- or over-utilized.
