### Sexual Orientation question assistance script for speaking with clients

Every two years, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) updates their data standards manual including data elements. These are questions that help direct funding for housing programs. This is information that is collected on all program participants to evaluate the needs within the communities that we serve. Sometimes, this is also done to identify underserved populations within the community.

Over the past few years, some new questions on our assessment focused on gender identity. This year, a new question focuses on sexual orientation and the intention is to get a better understanding of how folks identify themselves, in relation to this category. In the coming years, this information may be used to assess needed services within these groups. If you are comfortable answering this question, these are the available options:

- Bisexual
- Gay
- Questioning/Unsure
- Lesbian
